Veteran's Property Tax Exemption
Any veteran who served a minimum of 90 days consecutive active duty (excluding the training), was honorably discharged, and is a legal resident of New Mexico qualifies for a \$4,000 reduction in the taxable value of real property for county taxation purposes. This benefit also is available to non-remarried surviving spouses of a veteran who would have otherwise qualified for this benefit.

Disabled Veteran Property Tax Exemption
Any veteran who has been rated at 100 percent service-connected disabled by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), and is a legal resident of New Mexico, qualifies for a complete property tax waiver on his/her primary residence.

Note: Section 7-38-17 (G) of the law provides a penalty which states in part as follows: "any person...intentionally claiming and receiving the benefit of an exemption to which the person is not entitled...is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not more than one-thousand dollars (\$1,000)".
